





DISTRICT MANAGERS REPORT

Potential Grant Opportunity-

Attached is an article from the USDA Rural Development regarding Emergency Rural Healthcare Grants. This article is for your information only as the grant deadline has passed. Even though this a large sum, CHD would have to match 45% of the grant amount.

I have discussed this with Attorney Andrews and we agreed, the idea of proceeding with a new project at this time might be immature. Although the Power Project has provided utility access to the undeveloped sector of the District property, the potential development of that area will require quite a bit of analysis.

Further strategic planning is necessary. Financial opportunities will still be available when the district is prepared to receive them.



Emergency Rural Health Care Grants

What does this program do?

This program provides up to \$500 million in grant funding to help broaden access to COVID-19 testing and vaccines, rural health care services, and food assistance through food banks and food distribution facilities. Funding is distributed to eligible applicants through two tracks:

- Track One: Recovery
 Grants provide immediate
 relief to address economic
 conditions arising from the
 COVID-19 emergency
- Track Two: Impact Grants
 advance ideas and solutions
 to solve regional rural health
 care problems to support the
 long-term sustainability of
 rural health

Who may apply?

Eligible applicants include:

- Public bodies
- Community-based nonprofits
- Federally-recognized Tribes

Track Two: Impact applicants also must establish a network or group of health care provider organizations, economic development entities, or institutions of higher learning (which may include academic health and research institutes).

What is an eligible area?

Rural areas including cities, villages, towns, townships, and federally-recognized Tribal lands with no more than 20,000 residents – as determined by the latest U.S. Census data available at this link: (https://data.census.gov/cedsci/) – are considered eligible areas.

- are considered eligible areas.
Facilities and projects must be located in – and primarily serve – rural areas.

How may funds be used?

Grant funds must be used to support health care and nutritional assistance in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Track One: Recovery funds must be used to support immediate health care needs stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic, to help prepare for a future pandemic

event, or to increase access to quality health care services and improve community health outcomes. Applicants may request assistance for one or more of the categories below for expenses incurred on or after March 13, 2020. Grant awards range from \$25,000 - \$1 million, and funds must be used to:

- Increase capacity for vaccine distribution
- Provide medical supplies and equipment to increase medical surge capacity
- Reimburse for lost health care related-revenue used to maintain capacity during the pandemic
- Increase telehealth capabilities, including underlying healthcare information systems
- Construct temporary or permanent structures to provide health care services
- Support staffing needs for testing or vaccine administration
- Support facilities, equipment, and operating expenses associated with food banks and food distribution facilities



Emergency Rural Health Care Grants

Track Two: Impact funds must be used to support the longterm sustainability of rural health care. Long-term sustainability is defined as "improved health outcomes, improved access to quality health care, and creating and maintaining sustainable economic development for small communities." Applicants may request assistance for one or more of the categories below for expenses incurred during a three-year award period. Grant awards range from \$5 million to \$10 million, and must be used to:

- Establish or scale a regional partnership or group of community and health care leaders to plan, implement, and evaluate models to help solve regional health care problems and promote the long-term sustainability of rural health care
- Establish or scale evidencebased models and share lessons learned
- Identify a health-related problem within a region, develop and implement a method and solution, and conduct a program evaluation to examine healthrelated outcomes, long-term sustainability, and ability to successfully replicate

For both tracks, grant funds are limited to an applicable percentage of eligible project costs based on population and median household income of the population served.

What are the funding priorities?

Applications will be selected for funding based on a priority point system.

Factors for Track One:

Recovery applications include:
Distressed Communities,
median household income,
population, COVID-19 impacts,
and socioeconomic equity

Factors for Track Two: Impact applications include: Distressed Communities, median household income, and population; need, methodology, and innovation; organizational capacity and strength of consortium; workplan and proposed budget; evaluation, impact, and ability to replicate; and socioeconomic equity.

RESOLUTION NO. 10-19-21

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT

PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY, RATIFYING THE PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY BY GOVERNOR'S ORDER DATED MARCH 4, 2020, AND AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT FOR THE PERIOD OF OCTOBER 19, 2021 TO NOVEMBER 18, 2021 PURSUANT TO BROWN ACT PROVISIONS.

WHEREAS, the CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT's legislative body is open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code 54950 – 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the District's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, a required condition is that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, a proclamation is made when there is an actual incident, threat of disaster, or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the jurisdictions that are within the District's boundaries, caused by natural, technological, or human-caused disasters; and

WHEREAS, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, such conditions now exist in the District, specifically, the State of Emergency declared by Governor Newsom on March 4, 2020, due to COVID-19. Pursuant to the Governor's subsequent Executive Order N-29-20, issued on March 17, 2020, a local legislative body is authorized to hold public meetings via teleconferencing and to make public meetings accessible telephonically or otherwise electronically to all members of the public seeking to attend and to address the local legislative body. Masks are now optional for fully vaccinated employees and members of the public. Based on Occupational Safety & Hazard Agency (OSHA) standards, those entering without a mask are self-attesting to being fully vaccinated; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors does hereby find that the rise in SARS-CoV-2 Delta Variant has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District, and desires to proclaim a local emergency exists and ratify the proclamation of state of emergency by the Governor of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, as a consequence of the local emergency, the Board of Directors does hereby find that the District shall continue to conduct meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Government Code section 54953, as authorized by subdivision (e) of section 54953, and that such legislative bodies shall comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of section 54953; and.

WHEREAS, the CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT commenced virtual meeting protocols on April 21, 2020, which include options for public participation.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.
- 2. <u>Proclamation of Local Emergency</u>. The Board hereby proclaims that a local emergency now exists throughout the District, and COVID-19 has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District.
- 3. <u>Ratification of Governor's Proclamation of a State of Emergency</u>. The Board hereby ratifies the Governor of the State of California's Proclamation of State of Emergency, effective as of its issuance date of March 4, 2020.

- 4. <u>Remote Teleconference Meetings</u>. The District Manager and Staff of the District are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, but not limited to, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.
- 5. Effective Date of Resolution. This Resolution shall take effect on October 19, 2021, and shall be effective until the earlier of November 18, 2021, or such time the Board of Directors adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of the District may continue to teleconference without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953.
