REGULAR AGENDA:

Change Orders for Converse Construction – Tina Bonham presented a plan to include two Change Orders to the CHD Generator Project. Change order #1 would include an upgrade to the HVAC system at Corning Health Clinic – Adventist Health, allowing compatibility with the standby emergency power system. Change order #2 would incorporate the new generator housing with a previously approved building site. Combining the two buildings into one will improve the aesthetics of the campus and reduce the footprint of the combined foundation. A motion was made by Director Turner to approve Change Order #1 and Change Order #2 as presented, to include the HVAC upgrade and the increase in size of the housing structures concrete foundation, with a financial cap based on the figures presented. A second was made by Director Rodriguez. The motion was approved unanimously.

North Valley Catholic Social Services Lease Contract – We are currently waiting for a response from the administration of NVCSS regarding the terms of the lease agreement. A special meeting of the Board will be scheduled to vote to approve the Lease Contract for NVCSS.

ADMINISTRATION FEES FOR ASSESMENT COLLECTION

The fee is calculated pursuant to Revenue and Taxation (R&T) Code 97 and following, as a percentage of a local jurisdiction tax collection to the total collection countywide. This rate is then multiplied by the actual costs of assessing, collecting and apportioning property taxes to arrive at an appropriate charge per legislation. The cost of administration is equal to 3.225% of taxes deemed allocated.

Corning Healthcare District's fee is \$13,084, which equals 3.08% of the full amount collected on behalf of CHD.

NUMBERS SERVED

The Corning Healthcare District Elder Services Program has provided service to 106 clients from April through June. This number reflects phone calls, consultations, referrals, or other kinds of informal help, but not outreach.

HEALTH TALKS

The Corning Senior Center is still officially closed to the public due to COVID-19 and the congregate lunches have been converted to drive-through and pick up. The in-person monthly Health Talk has been suspended until the Senior Center reopens. Elaine developed a work-around that she will continue until the Senior Center reopens. She has been putting together monthly information packets to be handed out with the lunches.

- April Talking With Your Doctor / How To Choose a Doctor
- May Summer Safety
- June Elder Abuse

In **April** Elaine decided to follow up the previous month's topic of vaccinations by providing helpful information about talking with your doctor and how to choose a doctor. The raffle prize was a Corning Healthcare District bag filled with art supplies.

The topic for **May** was a special request from the Corning Senior Center Director, as the summer temperatures set in early: staying safe in the summer heat with an emphasis on hydration and heat stroke / exhaustion. In addition to the handouts, everyone in the drive-through lunch bunch got a water bottle the CHD name printed on it.



In keeping with the topic, the raffle prize was a pitcher with hydration incentives and water enhancement products. Elaine received a 'thank you' from the May raffle prize winner: "Thank you so much, it really made our day. We will definitely have a reason to drink lots of water"

June is Elder Abuse Awareness Month so Elaine supplied information about how to recognize elder abuse and what to do if elder abuse is suspected. The raffle prize was a home garden set, including seeds, soil, and pots.

FILE OF LIFE

- File of Life (refrigerator magnets and personal size) were shared with Greenville Rancheria, to be included in the bags that were handed out at their drive-thru health fair in May;
- File of Life refrigerator magnets were offered at the Corning Chamber of Commerce dinner in May;
- File of Life (refrigerator magnets and personal size) and pens with CHD logo were included in the Master Plan for Aging resource boxes sent out to all who attended the online June event;
- Elaine delivered File of Life to Latimer's Pharmacy to be distributed to their customers;
- File of Life shared with the library in Los Molinos;
- Elaine attended a meeting and when she was asked to introduce herself, she mentioned the File of Life in her comments. A woman spoke up and said she had picked up a File of Life at the library in Los Molinos for her elder mother. The File of Life proved useful when she had occasion to take her mother to the emergency room, as all her mother's pertinent medical information was right there. She decided to go back for more File of Life to give to her mother's senior friends.

HICAP

In person counseling is still off the board and Elaine has done no formal HICAP counseling during the period covered in this report, but she has answered questions as they arose from individuals looking for assistance.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The newsletter was emailed to 135 people/agencies, many of whom printed and distributed or forwarded by email to others. OTHER

- Older Americans Month Proclamation (April) Elaine prepared a
 proclamation for 2021 and received it in person from the Mayor of Corning
 with his seal and signature. In her acceptance remarks, Elaine thanked the
 Mayor and the City Council for the ongoing support and noted that the past
 year had been hard for everyone, but even more so for our elder
 population, who have been disproportionately affected by COVID-19. The
 recognition of our seniors and acknowledgment of their contributions is
 important now more than ever and greatly appreciated. (See attachment

- Master Plan for Aging Forum (June) Elaine participated as a panelist. (See attachments below.) She addressed an issue close to her heart the serious problem of people who are caught in the middle, those who do not qualify for medical or financial assistance, either because their income is too high or they have too many assets, but they are struggling to pay medical bills and living expenses. Many seniors fall through the cracks and are simply doing without. Elaine hopes the Master Plan for Aging will expand the qualification criteria, allowing more seniors to access assistance programs and get the help they need.

**NCLER Title II Auxiliary Benefits: Social Security Benefits You've Never Heard of and Who is Eligible for Them: When most people hear about "Social Security benefits," the first thought that comes to mind is income for older individuals who have retired from work. It's true that the Social Security system provides a foundation of retirement income that permits older adults to live in dignity, with over 46 million retired workers receiving benefits each month. However, the Social Security system is also the foundation of economic security for millions of family members of retired,

disabled, or deceased workers. In addition to retirement benefits, Social Security offers disability insurance protection to workers and their spouse and children, as well as life insurance that pays monthly survivors benefits to dependents if the worker dies. Through this training participants will understand the eligibility requirements for Social Security benefits for spouses and ex-spouses of retired, disabled, or deceased workers, as well as for children of retired, disabled, or deceased workers. About one American family in four receives income from Social Security benefits, and many more could receive this income if they knew they were eligible. These benefits offer an opportunity to provide more financial stability to eligible older adult households.

- Justice in Aging Protecting Dual Eligibles from Improper Billing: What Advocates Need to Know: People dually eligible for Medicare and Medi-Cal, including Qualified Medicare Beneficiaries (QMBs), have special protections against charges for Medicare co-payments and co-insurance. Yet, many times dually eligible individuals in California are improperly charged for medical care and prescription drugs. This webinar will provide a summary of what is and is not allowed by federal and state law and provide you with tools to help your clients when they have been improperly billed. 5/27
- Thresholds Brain Injury Coalition Music Therapy in Real Life: Music and the brain presented by Erin Haley, MA, MT-BC (Music Therapist-Board Certified) and Emmon Tobias MT-BC.

She provides information only and practical assistance whenever possible, as well as referrals (not endorsements) to appropriate health service providers when necessary. Elaine has responded to requests for help by providing information and educational material on a variety of health-related topics. During the months included in this report, Elaine took inquires and requests from seniors needing help or information on a variety of topics including questions about Medicare and memoir writing.

SUMMARY

During the months included in this report, Elder Services provided health and safety information, answers to Medicare questions, and community outreach to seniors in Tehama County. In addition File of Life was distributed, networking was achieved, vital contacts made, and the public profile of the Corning Healthcare District was enhanced.


MISSION STATEMENT, VALUES AND OBJECTIVES





Background:

New storage building is going in the proximate location as shown in yellow above. The generator building was to be added on to the trash enclosure at the bottom left. The generator building and storage building had a potential conflict. This was due to the west side of the building has a ramp and entrance which extends towards the trash enclosure.

The cost of the new generator building was \$18,000. Instead of 2 separate building this change order moves the generator next to new building. This move has several advantages.

- This first eliminates any potential conflicts between the structures.
- The generator has a directional bore from 275 Solano. For small cost increase this can bring 100A of 120/240V power to the new structure. This power is sufficient for the building and future structures.

- 4. Simplifies the permits. Both structures will be under single permit.

BUDGET REVISION REPORT

CD Interest - From \$4,938.00 to \$2877.00

The actual amount of interest from the CD's held at Edward Jones will be a lesser amount in 2021-2022 due to interest rates declining as certain CD's have reached maturity. Given the major capital expansions for this year we are opting for maximum liquidity.

Assessment Income - From \$376,000.000 to \$400,000.00

The total amount of assessment income for 2020-2021 was \$424,421.00, up 18% from the prior fiscal year. The projected total for 2021-2022 is \$400,000, allowing for a decrease of 5.75% in assessment income for next fiscal year.

Health Insurance - From \$51,513.00 to \$52,550.00

The actual projected cost of employee health benefits for 2021-2022 is \$52,550.00. This cost has increased 3.3% from last fiscal year.

Outside services - From \$59,600.00 to \$67,000.00

In prior years many outside services were accounted for in the chart of accounts line item titled "Admin Other". This year our Budget shows an increase in the dollar amount listed on the chart of accounts line item titled "Outside Services" and a considerable decrease in "Admin Other". These services include janitorial, landscaping and bookkeeping. There has been no discussion of cost increases in these services, but given the level of inflation, these discussions are anticipated.
