CALL TO ORDER: 6:00 pm

DIRECTOR'S REPORT: None given

DISTRICT MANAGER: Tina Hale reported on correspondence with Tehama County Social Services Director Laura Hawkins regarding the Corning office closure. Director Boles expressed concern that our mission to bring services to the Southern County community is being ignored. District Counsel Andrews reminded us that the Meuser Building was built to bring the County services to one location. It was the top need at that time and the need is still present today. It is the consensus of the Board to request a meeting with agency representatives to discuss the current and future issues arising from this situation. Our District exists to bring healthcare related services to the people of Southern Tehama County. It is our duty to do everything within our power to see this mission through.

The upgrade to the HVAC system at 155 Solano was discussed. It is on track to be completed before the end of the fiscal year and within the budgeted amount.

The District Manager also reported that the Emergency Power Generators are installed and fully operational. A ribbon cutting ceremony will be held on April 22, 2022, at 3:00 pm on the CHD campus.

COMMENTS AND REPORTS FROM MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT: Mike Smith reported on remodeling and combining the two existing buildings next to the new maintenance shop. This project will be revisited at a later date.

Chief Deputy Director Teresa Curiel approached the Board of Supervisors with an update on the department's employment rate on Tuesday, saying the department continues to struggle with retaining employees.

The Corning Social Services office, inside the Meuser Memorial Health Center, was temporary closed in December but at the end of January the board voted to keep the office closed as a result of staffing shortages and excessive overtime.

"The two positions that are critical for our operations in Corning are the classifications of Office Assistants and Eligibility Specialists," Curiel said. "We have 31 positions allocated for the office assistant series, of which only

eight we have been able to maintain and fill. So that's a vacancy rate of 74 percent. Of the eight that are filled, we have one that is on a leave of absence. For our eligibility specialists, we have 71 positions in our position allocation list of which 48 are filled, which is a vacancy rate of 32 percent. Of the 48 filled, we have three on a leave of absence."

According to Curiel, the department broke even in February despite four new location will remain closed until employees being hired.

Two office assistants were hired, but then two other office assistants left. One sought employment elsewhere and another received an internal promotion. Two eligibility specialists were hired, but two specialists left due to an internal promotion and retirement.

For March, there is one new office assistant expected to be recruited, but there have been no new eligibility specialists hired.

St. Elizabeth Community Hospital

- St. Elizabeth Community Hospital is the only hospital seated in Tehama County. This includes the county's only Emergency Department and Family Birth Center. Additionally, St. Elizabeths operates the county's only ambulance fleet directly serving Tehama County communities.
- Dependent on 911 call volumes and locations, St. Elizabeth's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) team strives to station an ambulance or supervisor vehicle (able to respond to emergencies) in the Corning community on a daily basis.
- St. Elizabeths operates the Solano St. Clinic to provide increased access to primary care to South County. Providing high quality care to Corning and its nearby communities is a priority for hospital leadership.
- In FY21, St. Elizabeths provided \$27,881,855 in community grants, programs, charity care, and unreimbursed services specifically to residents and communities of Tehama County.
- Covered in these funds are community grants that St. Elizabeth awarded to non-profit organizations working to improve health status and quality of life. In FY21, the hospital awarded the grants totaling \$59,304. Specific to South County, Empower Tehama received \$37,804 for the South County Victim Outreach Project. The project will support victim services in South Tehama County and improve capacities to provide comprehensive wraparound services to victims and survivors of intimate partner violence and address the barriers that exist for underserved populations.

DISTRICT MANAGERS REPORT:

The board of directors of Corning Healthcare District has shown interest in funding the purchase of a new ambulance for St. Elizabeth's Community Hospital.

This purchase is financially feasible for fiscal year 2022-2023. Our current capital project will be wrapped up by the first of May 2022, at which time CHD will be able to pledge \$95,000 for the full purchase. The terms being \$10,000 paid in July 2022, \$40,000 paid in February 2023 and the remainder paid in June 2023.

These terms will allow CHD to budget this project for next year and keep our cash flow at an acceptable level.

It is preferable that we pledge these terms to Dignity Health after the first of May, in case any unforeseen expenses arise during the completion of the current project.

Recommendation: Pledge to St. Elizabeth's Hospital \$95,000 for the purchase of a new ambulance, with the Corning Healthcare District logo, under the aforementioned terms.

RESOLUTION NO. 3-15-22

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT

PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY, RE-RATIFYING THE PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY BY GOVERNOR'S ORDER DATED MARCH 4, 2020 AND AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT FOR THE PERIOD OF MARCH 15, 2022 TO APRIL 14, 2022 PURSUANT TO BROWN ACT PROVISIONS.

WHEREAS, the CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT's legislative body is open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code 54950 – 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the District's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, a required condition is that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, a proclamation is made when there is an actual incident, threat of disaster, or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the jurisdictions that are within the District's boundaries, caused by natural, technological, or human-caused disasters; and

WHEREAS, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors previously adopted a Resolution, Number 10-6-21 on October 6, 2021 finding that the requisite conditions exist for the legislative body of CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT to conduct remote teleconference meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953. This Resolution was re-ratified on November 16, 2021 based on a further finding that the requisite conditions continued to exist for the legislative body of CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT to conduct remote teleconference meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953.; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of extending the use of the provisions found in section 54953(e), the Board of Directors must reconsider the circumstances of the state of emergency that exists in the District, and the Board of Directors has done so; and

WHEREAS, such conditions now exist in the District, specifically, the State of Emergency declared by Governor Newsom on March 4, 2020, due to COVID-19. Pursuant to the Governor's subsequent Executive Order N-29-20, issued on March 17, 2020 a local legislative body is authorized to hold public meetings via teleconferencing and to make public meetings accessible telephonically or otherwise electronically to all members of the public seeking to attend and to address the local legislative body. Masks are now optional for fully vaccinated employees and members of the public. Based on Occupational Safety & Hazard Agency (OSHA) standards, those entering without a mask are self-attesting to being fully vaccinated; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors does hereby find that the rise in SARS-CoV-2 Delta Variant has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District, and desires to proclaim a local emergency exists and ratify the proclamation of state of emergency by the Governor of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, as a consequence of the local emergency, the Board of Directors does hereby find that the District shall continue to conduct meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Government Code section 54953, as authorized by subdivision (e) of section 54953, and that such legislative bodies shall comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of section 54953; and;

WHEREAS, the CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT commenced virtual meeting protocols on April 21, 2020 which include options for public participation.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the CORNING HEALTHCARE DISTRICT as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals.</u> The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.
- 2. <u>Proclamation of Local Emergency</u>. The Board hereby proclaims that a local emergency now exists throughout the District, and COVID-19 has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District.
- 3. <u>Ratification of Governor's Proclamation of a State of Emergency</u>. The Board hereby ratifies the Governor of the State of California's Proclamation of State of Emergency, effective as of its issuance date of March 4, 2020.
- 4. Remote Teleconference Meetings. The District Manager and Staff of the District are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, but not limited to, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.
- 5. Effective Date of Resolution. This Resolution shall take effect on March 15, 2022, and shall be effective until the earlier of April 14, 2022, or such time the Board of Directors adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of the District may continue to teleconference without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953.
